**Information Source:** Personnel folder of director  $(\mathbf{R})$ , transcripts  $(\mathbf{R})$ , job applications  $(\mathbf{R})$ , provider's documentation or verification of education and/or experience  $(\mathbf{R})$ .

The certification timeframes and requirements vary from those in the phase-in plan for the revised Minimum Standards. Please read the following certification guidelines carefully:

Directors of centers must meet Texas Rising Star Provider Certification Criterion II, Director Qualifications, at the time of initial assessment.

When a Texas Rising Star Provider loses its director a maximum hold harmless period of six months will be allowed for the provider to come into compliance with the applicable criteria. If the provider fails to comply within the six month period, the provider will lose its Texas Rising Star Provider status until it is again in compliance.

#### **COMPLIANCE NOTES:**

When a Texas Rising Star Provider falls below the certification requirements for staff training due to turnover, a maximum hold harmless period of six months will be allowed for the provider to come into compliance with the applicable criteria. If the provider fails to comply within the six month period, the provider will lose its Texas Rising Star status until it is again in compliance

Examples of "related fields" include elementary education, child psychology, and recreation leadership.

With reference to option 1.D., some director credentials that focus on administration may enable the holder to meet the director qualification. These credentials may not meet requirements for training in child development that are necessary to meet the staff supervision requirements. This measure allows supervision by staff other than the director if that other staff meets the requirements in 1.D.

In measure #1, "no less than one caregiver" refers to staffing in a small center where 30% of a staff could be only one caregiver, or percentage-wise, less than one caregiver. Example: a provider has 2 caregiver staff. To meet the 30% requirement (2x.30) the provider would have .6 caregiver staff (round off to 1) meeting requirements.

Examples of related fields are elementary education, child psychology, and recreation administration.

**Information Source:** Written training plan (**R**), training certificates (**R**), orientation plans (**R**), interviews with staff (**I**), bulletin board postings of training opportunities (**O**), other documentation maintained by the provider (**R**).

"For **part-time** staff, the plan provides for a minimum of 15 clock hours of training, with a total of 10 clock hours related to school-age development and curriculum."

#### **COMPLIANCE NOTES:**

The training plan must include specific opportunities for staff working with school-age children to participate in training that addresses school-age development and curriculum.

On measure #3, the training plan must address all areas specified in the CDA competencies.

Only three hours of independent reading are counted.

No hours of CPR or First Aid are counted.

On measure #4, all new staff must receive six hours of training during their first six weeks.

\* Independent reading refers to a caregiver reading books or articles. Independent study refers to study done at home, through television study programs or self-study programs that have written goals and objectives, a curriculum, preand post-testing and a recognition of achievement at the close of the study program. The <u>Texas Child Care Quarterly</u> self study guides are considered independent studies, as is viewing of TWC-approved video tapes. Independent study hours are not limited.

For mixed age groups, the size of the group is determined by the age of the youngest child in the group. If it is necessary to mix groups in a wider age range than categories listed, and the youngest child in the group is younger than 18 months, the oldest child in the group must not be more than 18 months older than the youngest child. Refer to TDPRS Minimum Standards for other exceptions. All Minimum Standards must be met.
